Mission, Spirituality & Pastoral Care

Employees, Members and Volunteers of the St Vincent de Paul Society are driven by our values. Key amongst our values is compassion – welcoming and serving all with understanding and without judgment. Fr Gregory Boyle is a Jesuit priest who founded Homeboys Industries, a US-based organisation dedicated to rehabilitating former prisoners and gang members.

In his book Tattoos on the Heart he wrote:

"Here is what we seek: a compassion that can stand in awe at what the poor have to carry rather than stand in judgment at how they carry it. Kindness is the only strength there is."


He goes on to talk about "inching ourselves closer to creating a community of kinship such that God might recognise it. Soon we imagine, with God, this circle of compassion.

Then we imagine no one standing outside of that circle, moving ourselves closer to the margins so that the margins themselves will be erased. We stand there with those whose dignity has been denied. We locate ourselves with the poor and the powerless and the voiceless.

At the edges, we join the easily despised and the readily left out. We stand with the demonised so that the demonising will stop. We situate ourselves right next to the disposable so that the day will come when we stop throwing people away."

"Compassion isn't just about feeling the pain of others; it's about bringing them in toward yourself. If we love what God loves, then, in compassion, margins get erased. 'Be compassionate as God is compassionate,' means the dismantling of barriers that exclude."
