Conference housing for people experiencing homelessness

For many years St Mary Star of the Sea Conference facilitated access to discounted holiday rental accommodation for the people we assist. With the worsening housing crisis in the Shoalhaven and the Conference no longer able to manage the holiday units, management of the Mollymook flats has been transferred to Vinnies Services Housing and Homelessness division.

As of 1 July 2025, the Mollymook flats are being used to provide temporary accommodation with case management support for families experiencing homelessness, including women and children escaping domestic and family violence.

Our thanks to the Milton Ulladulla Conference for all their work over the years managing the flats, and especially Betty Cotter for the joy they brought to many families and clients. While the units are no longer available for holiday accommodation, they will continue to have potentially life-changing impacts for the people and families who now have a safe and secure place to call home while they get their lives back on track.

Mission, Spirituality & Pastoral Care

In September in Rome, Pope Leo XIV will canonise two very young saints – Blessed Carlo Acutis and Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati.

Carlo Acutis was a British-born Italian, who was only 15 when he died from leukaemia. He was considered, even by adult computer engineers, a genius in anything to do with computers. Carlo was devoted to the Eucharist from the age of 7, never missing an opportunity for daily Mass. He very successfully used the internet to draw young people to the Eucharist.

Pier Giorgio Frassati is very special to us in the Society.

Frassati was born in 1901 in Turin, Italy. Despite neither of his parents being religious, he grew up with a deep faith and a strong prayer life - which his parents didn't approve of!

From a young age, Pier Giorgio demonstrated faith in action, often giving away his possessions and significant amounts of money. At the age of 17, he joined the St Vincent de Paul Society.

Pier Giorgio embraced life. He was considered handsome and was adventurous and athletic. He was an avid hiker and mountain climber, as well as a lover of arts and music. He would organise outings in the mountains with his friends, which often served as opportunities for prayer and discussions about their faith on the way up or down from the summit. He was also known for his sense of humour and practical jokes. In his beatification homily in 1990, Pope John Paul II said:

"At a superficial glance, Frassati's lifestyle, that of a modern young man who was full of life, does not present anything out of the ordinary. This, however, is the originality of his virtue, which invites us to reflect upon it and impels us to imitate it. In him faith and daily events are harmoniously fused, so that adherence to the Gospel is translated into loving care for the poor and the needy.....Entirely immersed in the mystery of God and totally dedicated to the constant service of his neighbour: thus we can sum up his earthly life!"

Pier Giorgio embarked on studies to become an engineer. Sadly, before completing his university degree, he contracted polio (which he is believed to have caught from the sick people he was visiting). He passed away on 4th July 1925 at the age of 24. For his funeral, the streets of the city were lined with hundreds of mourners who were unknown to his family – the poor of Turin whom he had served for the past seven years.

Pier Giorgio Frassati is one of the Patrons of World Youth Day and also the worldwide Patron of Vincentian Youth. Our youth conference in the Lismore Central Council bears his name.

I love that these two young people highlight the magnificence that our youth can be. As the mother of two young adults, observing them and their friends in this world, as well as the big hearted and capable young Vincentians we have both working for the organisation, and as members who volunteer their time on weekends, I believe our future is in very good hands.
