VISIT TO THE AUBURN DISTRIBUTION CENTRE

A group of members and membership support staff from Parramatta CC took up an offer to tour the Auburn DC – what an operation!!, as well as seeing the pathway of donations to shops, recycling, etc members were able to see the items given to people in need .

The Auburn DC has 30 warehouse staff and 20 drivers to service the Metropolitan area. We cover as far as Katoomba all the way to Hornsby and everything towards the coastline. We provide textiles and bric a brac for 65 stores using our own fleet of 14 trucks.

Once donations have been collected from our stores or one of the 90 Donations bins sites it is returned to the Distribution centre where it is isolated for 48 hours prior to being sorted, this ensures we remain vigilant around the current pandemic, all staff are required to wear gloves and are given the opportunity to wear a mask if they would like, where possible the 1.5m rule is in place.

Our sorters sort on average 45 tonnes of textiles a week, of this 1700 boxes a week of great clothing is created and made available for stores to order. Each box weighs approx. 6kg to ensure that our workers in our stores can easily fill their clothes racks.

The remaining textiles that are not suitable for sale form part of our Vinnies Textiles Recycling business, or VTR as we like to call it. These items are sold and then used to create exciting items such as bath towels, rugs, and door mats to name a few. This aligns with our strategic plan of having minimal or no textile waste to landfill by 2022

The revenue generated from our shops and VTR also allows us to purchase new items for welfare, we deliver to those in need such items as beds, mattresses, tables and chairs and an array of manchester. This is achieved by working closely with Vinnies support centres across the Metropolitan region.

OLOL Baulkham Hills Socks and Beanies

As part of their social justice programme Our Lady of Lourdes Primary School at Baulkham Hills ran a "Socks and Beanies Drive" with the proceeds going to the local Vinnies Conference.

Through their efforts the children donated:

3 blankets, **68** scarves, **115** pairs of gloves, **146** beanies and **643** pairs of socks.

The donations have been valued at \$4,200. This is a truly remarkable contribution, particularly at a time when so many in our school communities are doing it tough.

Due to the enormity of the response, OLOL Conference at Baulkham Hills South was able not only to provide an assortment of socks and other items to their regular clients, but also to share the proceeds with other Conferences in the Hills Region, as well as The Vinnies

Van, the Vinnies Service Centres at Blacktown and Harris Park, the Jesuit Refugee Service at Westmead and the Lisa Harnum Foundation operating in the Hills District assisting victims of domestic violence. Donations were gratefully accepted by all parties.

Our Lady of Lourdes Primary School has a long history of supporting the OLOL Vinnies Conference under the guidance of the Principal and his hard-working staff. The children and their parents and guardians continue to demonstrate outstanding generosity and care in the magnitude of their donations.

How can you use an Albert Terminal?

By taking cashless donations from your parishioners as they exit church or by taking cashless donations from the general public at your fundraising activities (e.g. Bunnings BBQ, Donation Drive at your local Shopping Centre etc)

What does a Personalised Fundraising Page look like?

Are the funds raised from a Personalised Fundraising Page received by your Conference?

NSW Community Sleepout

On Friday 23 October, we held our first ever virtual NSW Vinnies Community Sleepout.

209 participants across the state came together and slept out at home in their car, backyard or couch. They were connected via a live stream hosted by Channel Nine and 2GB presenter, Deborah Knight and tuned in to our brave speakers, inspiring videos and live crosses around the state.

So far, \$136,000 has been raised for Vinnies Services and programs in twelve NSW locations. In Western Sydney 35 locals raised \$37000 with all proceeds going towards the Vinnies Van and the Vinnies Hubs in Blacktown, Penrith and Harris Park.


Vinnies Youth Conference Connect

Over the past few months, Vinnies Metro Youth have responded to the changing needs of those we support and the work done by Conferences, by participating in the Vinnies Youth Conference Connect Project. It is an initiative developed by the Vinnies State Youth Team, which facilitates the matching of willing young volunteers and members to support Conferences in continuing their work during these challenging and uncertain times.

As part of the project, Conferences have been able to ask for Vinnies youth volunteers and members to be involved with their Conference work by being a youth volunteer 'Helping Hand or 'Listening Ear'. The Helping Hands Volunteers have been helping to pack hampers and drop off food vouchers. The Listening Ear Volunteers have been working with Conferences to make social phone calls to people to help address the loneliness and uncertainty that these times bring, the social phone calls complements the work being by Conference Members.

Important dates in the Social Justice Calendar

10/10 World Mental Health

Vinnies NSW works closely with those experiencing mental ill-health and has

seen first-hand how homelessness, unemployment, and social isolation can impact mental health and well-being.

In October last year, Vinnies NSW launched the *Mental Health and Well -being Social Justice Statement*" at the annual Rosalie Rendu Forum. This was a symbolic commitment to do more as a Society in response to the challenges people face when experiencing mental ill-health.



In August this year, the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference released their Social Justice statement, '*To Live Life to the Full: Mental health in Australia today*'. The Bishops' Statement aligns well with the Vinnies NSW Mental Health and Well-being Social Justice Statement, and is a timely reminder for us to better support one another and break down the stigma associated with mental ill-health.

On Wednesday 16/09, Vinnies hosted a Webinar to learn more about the Bishops Statement on Mental Health, ongoing challenges people face in accessing the care and support they need, and to discuss ways in which the St Vincent de Paul Society NSW can take action.

Vinnies Build Homes, Build Hope is campaigning for the NSW Government to invest in 5,000 new social housing homes every year for the next 10 years. We are doing this because there are more than 100,000 people waiting for social housing across NSW right now – some of whom will wait up to ten years. At the same time, 37,000 people are homeless. We launched our campaign in September last year. Since that time, in spite of drought, floods, bushfires and a pandemic, Members of the Society have had more than 100 engagements with their MPs and collected 11,733 signatures on our *Build Homes, Build Hope* petition. This achievement resulted in St Vincent de Paul Society CEO, Jack de Groot, and Vice President Social Justice, Brooke Simmons, delivering the petition to NSW Parliament. Alex Greenwich, the Independent MP for Sydney, received the petition and committed to table it in Parliament this week. He will also arrange for the petition to be debated, necessitating a response from the Minister for Housing in the Legislative Assembly, as soon as the Parliamentary schedule permits.
