I'm pleased to share this summary of the impact of the good works undertaken by Conferences in 2022-23, including information on the people we assisted and the ways in which we did this.

Despite the challenges faced in 2022-23, members of the Society made a tremendous impact to assist the most vulnerable members of our communities. 3939 members made 14,880 visits to homes, hospitals, aged care facilities and prisons to offer care and assistance across NSW. Members assisted 88,256 people and delivered \$13,656,509 worth of food, energy assistance and other cost-of-living relief.

Significantly, members acted as a light of hope for people who feel alone in the darkness of their hardship.

I look forward to working together as we make a greater impact for the people we assist through your good works as we strive to shape a more just and compassionate society.

YOUR GOOD WORKS

From 1 July 2022 to 30 June 2023 members of **Waterloo Our Lady of Mt Carmel Conference** assisted **354 people** and conducted **879 visits**.

WHO YOU ASSISTED

39% of people assisted were female

61% of people assisted were male

0% of people assistance identified with another gender identity

12% indicated that they were under housing stress

26% identified as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander

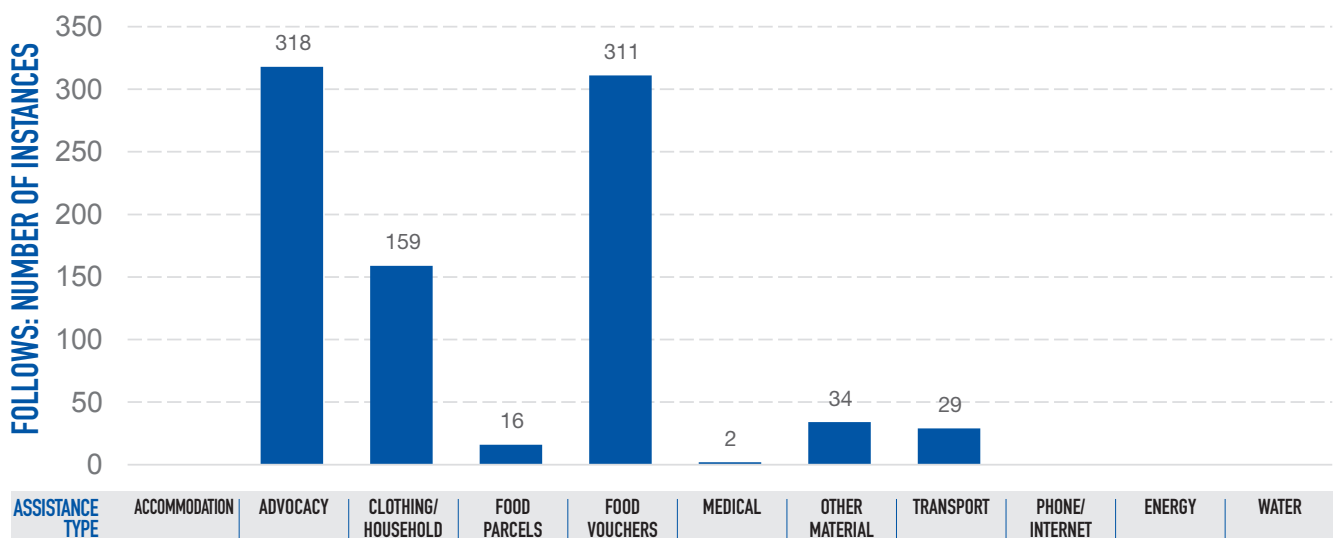
22% said they had a disability

21% said the main language they speak is a language other than English

Many of those you assisted had families and dependents who also benefitted from your support – this means you reached an additional **190 people**.

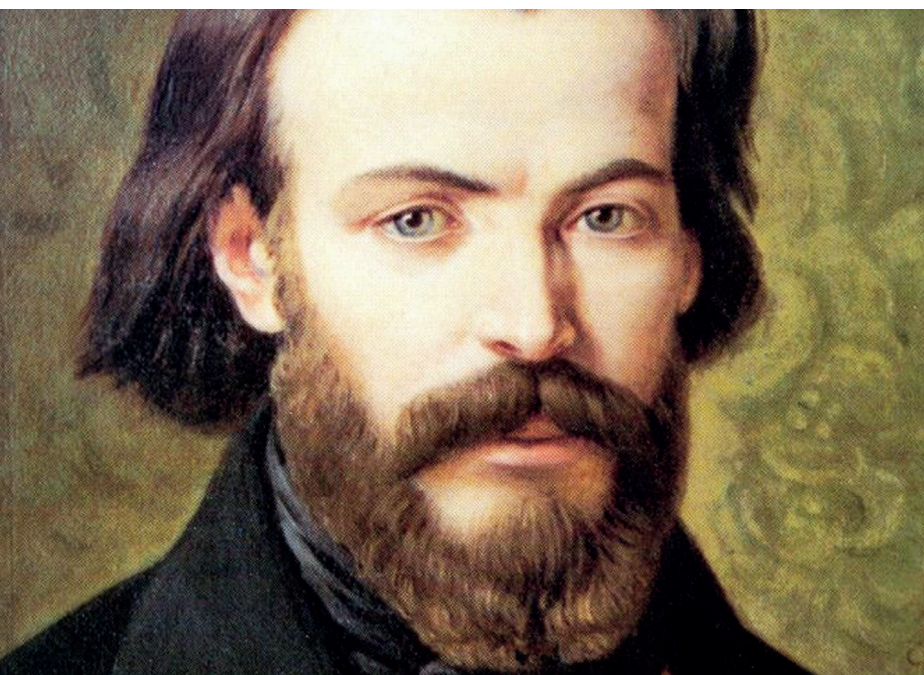

MEMBERSHIP SURVEY 2023

WHAT MEMBERS ARE SAYING

- ✦ Close to a third of respondents said that they are involved with the Society because the organisation has assisted them, or someone they know, in the past.
- ✦ They tell us that they feel strongly that the Society is ethical and that the main reason they joined the organisation was to make a difference in the community.
- ✦ More than three quarters of respondents say that members, volunteers and staff work well together, and that the Society's social justice resonates with them and their understanding of those we assist.
- ✦ They tell us that their Conference President is supportive, that their contribution to the Society gives them a feeling of accomplishment, and that they like the work they do.
- ✦ A majority of respondents say that the Society communicates effectively about what is happening for members and volunteers.

KEY STATS

- ✦ 93% say they like the kind of work or assistance they provide.
- ✦ 89% say they are involved with the Society to contribute and positively impact or make a difference to the community.
- ✦ 89% say their contribution to the Society gives them a feeling of personal accomplishment.
